



HISTORY AND ART

Founded by Emperor Peter the Great in 1703, St. Petersburg was the capital of the Russian Empire until 1918. The city has attracted talented and ambitious people from all over Europe. Rich in history, art and culture is famous for its vibrant, cosmopolitan atmosphere and some of the most beautiful architecture in the world.

- Exclusive opening of the State Hermitage Museum, visit the main collection outside normal hours, the second-largest art museum in the world, founded in 1764. Its collections incorporates over 3 million items, including the largest collection of paintings in the world and now the permanent home of the Hermitage's exceptional collection of impressionist and post-impressionist paintings. Exclusive demonstration of the Peacock Clock, one of the most prominent and enchanting pieces of the Museum.
- Unique private guided tour with an art historian at the State Russian Museum, formerly the Russian Museum of His Imperial Majesty Alexander III. The world's largest collection of Russian art, housed in a unique architectural complex in the historical center.
- Explore the first stone building in the city, The Menshikov Palace, a Petrine Baroque edifice situated on Vasilyevsky Island. Since 1981, it has served as a public museum, a branch of the Hermitage Museum with a collection of Russian art of 17th and 18th century.





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- With a professional architect visit St. Isaac's Cathedral with Colonnade, built by order of Tsar
 Alexander I, one of the largest churches in Saint-Petersburg and one of the most impressive
 buildings in the city center. Inside the cathedral, explore an exhibition telling the incredible
 story of its construction, reach the summit of the cathedral in order to discover one of the
 best panoramic views of the city.
- Indulge in Faberge Museum, settled in a perfectly restored palace that will plunge you in the magnificence of the Imperial times, privately visit the museum that boasts one of the richest and biggest collection of artworks by the famous jeweler Peter Carl Faberge. A highlight of the museum's collection is the group of nine Imperial Easter eggs created by Fabergé for the last two Russian Tsars. The collection includes refined everyday objects, tableware, master paintings, and Russian icons.
- With a professional architect visit to Peterhof Park, former residence of the Emperors and the home of several palaces with the Grand Palace as its main landmark. Be amazed by the halls, brightly decorated with gold, marble and numerous mirrors. In summer get enchanted by the incredible collection of fountains in the gardens.





WHITE NIGHTS FESTIVAL

The White Nights Festival in St. Petersburg is an annual international arts festival during the season of the midnight sun and consists of a series of classical ballet, opera and music events. Due to the latitude, St. Petersburg is well known for the remarkable natural phenomenon "white nights", which lasts from late May until mid-June. It became a symbol of the city and a time rich with festivals, entertainment, and cultural events. During the festival, there are daily evening performances at the Mariinsky Theatre (either ballet or opera) and almost daily evening performances at the newly built Mariinsky Concert Hall - one of the best-sounding halls in the world.

- Fire the cannon at noon at Petropavlovskaya Fortress. This tradition originates from Peter's epoch, when the cannons announced the beginning and the end of the working day, alerted the local citizens about the floods and marked important state events.






EPICUREAN
